

Course Description – We will investigate the ideas, events, and individuals that that have shaped the various themes throughout United States History. We will work towards developing the skills of the historian: reading research, analysis, writing, and speaking. The class will help each student to develop critical life skills and better prepare them for the next step in their academic careers.

First Semester – Foundations of the American Republic, Civil War and Reconstruction, Industrial Revolution, Rise of U.S. to a World Power, Progressive Era and WWI, The Roaring 20's.

Second Semester – The Great Depression and The New Deal, World War II, The Cold War Era, 1980's to Present Day, Culminating Research Project.

Classroom Behavior and Expectations:

Be on time. Be prepared. Be respectful. Appropriate use of electronic devices. (No use without permission) Abide by all established school rules.

Grading Policy - Grades are an important measure of academic effort and achievement. We will employ a wide variety of assessment methods to obtain an evaluation of each student's progress throughout the year. Points will be earned through: class participation, projects, group work, tests and quizzes, homework, class notebooks, performances, research paper and enrichment activities. Semester grades are cumulative from the previous quarter. Standard percentage grading scales will be used.
