The **Economics** class content includes the following areas:

Economic Terms and Concepts; Markets and Global Competition; Supply, Demand and Pricing; Government and Economic Policy; Money and Banking; Income, Employment and Labor; Personal Economic decisions and responsibility.

Classroom behavior and expectations:

Respect - Respecting yourself, your fellow classmates and your teacher will automatically equate to a positive academic year.

Grading Policy - Grades are an important measure of academic effort and achievement. We will employ a wide variety of assessment methods to obtain an evaluation of each student's progress throughout the year. Points will be earned through: class participation, projects, group work, tests and quizzes, homework, and the senior project. Semester grades are cumulative from the previous quarter. Standard percentage grading scales will be used.

Absences and Tardies - Standard school policy will be used for missing class and makeup work. Studies have shown repeatedly that the number one factor in a student's success is regular attendance.

Electronics - Computers are to be kept away until instructed by the teacher. Students should only use the computer for class-related work. Cell phones are not allowed out in class at all.

Cheating - Students caught cheating or plagiarizing will receive a zero for the assignment and lose extra credit opportunities.

Employability Mark - An employability mark is earned in lieu of a citizenship grade. Students are assessed on punctuality, productivity, teamwork skills, positive work ethic and acceptance of authority.
